INFORMATION

Dickson Timber is 155 acres of rolling oak and hickory forest. Many wild plants & animal species call Dickson Timber home. The forest provides habitat for native songbirds, especially during migrations and birds of prey like barred owls, great horned owls and red tail hawks. Raccoons, deer, squirrels, rabbits, the occasional fox and coyote and many other mamma species live here among the dynamic forest. Hiking through the timber, you'll notice new sapling trees and fallen dead logs which are habitat for numerous insects, spiders, frogs and toads, reptiles, and other small creatures that are the basis in the intricate forest ecosystem.

The shelter house at Dickson Timber can be used on a first-come, first served basis or reserved, the maximum capacity inside the shelter is 60. For reservations, pricing, and availability.

The campground at Dickson Timber includes 12 electric sites as well as 8 equestrian sites. Corrals are available for the horses. There are primitive restrooms and water. All fires must be built in designated fire rings or grills. Visitors may pick strawberries, raspberries, mulberries, nuts and mushrooms, but please do not pick wildflowers.

Hiking trails wind through the forest for birdwatchers, hunters, cross country skiers, snowmobiles, and horseback riders. To prevent erosion, the Dickson Timber equestrian trails may be closed temporarily. You can call ahead at (712) 775-2710 for current trail conditions.

<u>Trail permit fees</u>: Daily: \$2.00 Annually: \$15.00 Annual Permits expire on January 10th of the following year.

RULES & REGULATIONS

Park hours

All county parks are closed from 10:30 PM – 5:00 AM. All non-register park visitors must leave before 10:30 PM.

Alcoholic beverages

No kegs are allowed. All laws of the State of lowa regarding consumption of alcohol will be strictly observed. Violations of state code will result in expulsion from the building, revocation of rental privileges and forfeiture of deposit. Ensure compliance with sec. 123.47 respecting possession of alcohol by minors and agree to abide by all rules and regulations of the conservation board and the state of lowa.

Trees & Shrubs

Trees and shrubbery must not be cut or damaged in any way. Berries, fruits, and mushrooms may be harvested in the park.

Pets

All pets must be kenneled or leashed, no more than 6ft long, except in hunting areas.

Firearms and Weapons

All firearms, weapons, and explosives are prohibited in all county parks except during hunting seasons in designated county hunting areas. Fireworks are prohibited at all times.

Garbage

All refuse must be placed in disposal cans or dumpsters provided.

Reservations/Payments/Deposit

You must be 21 years of age to rent a facility, contact our office to make reservations. Payments are due within 10 days of making the reservation. We hold your refundable damage deposit until after your event, once the shelter has been left in good, clean condition and tables have been returned to their original location and are not lost or damage we will shred your deposit check.
