What's New... By Matt Cosgrove

On May 23rd the "Students in the Arts" (SITA) Program unveiled enhancements to the natural playscape at Kennedy Park with a celebration of music, food & fun. The improvements include:

- A Dino-Discovery a sand table with ceramic dinosaur bones, paint brushes for exploring and interpretive signs about dinosaurs;
- Rocks painted as ladybugs or inspirational messages;
- 3-D metal insects mounted on ten-foot poles and placed on Discovery Point

The "Students in the Arts" Program is a way to recognize local 5th & 6th Grade Students that excel in the visual and preforming arts. The program was started in 1995 and is led by Ann Halbur. Students are nominated by their teachers from area schools and come together for two months to brainstorm, collaborate & complete a project.

The 2019 SITA Project marks the second time students have chosen Kennedy Park to display their work. In 2018, the students worked with Iowa Central Community College Graphics Designers and the Fort Dodge Industrial Technology Program to create metal art called "Prairie Feathers" along the trail entering the park.

The Webster County Conservation Board is extremely grateful for the partnership with the SITA Program, Ann Halbur, project sponsors and community partners and is excited to share the appreciation of the arts as part of the outdoor experience at Kennedy Park.



Renters must be at least 18 years old to rent and provide a photo ID and/or current driver's license upon check out. We do require proof of completion of a paddle safety course in order to rent. 
