Items supplied at cabin:


- Microwave
- Refrigerator (dorm-sized)
- Basic set of dinner service for six
- Coffee maker
- Toilet paper
- Disinfectant cleaners
- Broom, dustpan, mop, bucket, and sponge
- One load of firewood/day (more may be purchased from campground host). No splitting of firewood on porches.
- There is no air conditioning
- Garbage container with bags
- Adequate electrical storage for normal sustainable living use

Items renter should or may bring:

- Complete bedding (sleeping bag or sheets and covers; pillow)
- Extra cooking and eating utensils
- All food and beverages
- Bath towels and toiletries
- Radio/computer (turn off when not used)
- Lawn chairs
- A pet is allowed, but the pet stay must be purchased when making the online reservation.



Cabins are available year-round. Winter is a great time for a cabin stay! Ask to borrow a pair of snowshoes.



Overnight comfort conscious of conservation and environment!



Cabin Information:

- The fee of \$95/night includes all basic rental, taxes, and credit card fees. An additional small fee is charged by the reservation site.
- There is a \$25 fee to bring a pet. If bringing a pet, be sure to "purchase" this "item" when making your reservation
- There is a two-night minimum stay on weekends, and three-night minimum stay on Memorial Day and Labor Day Weekends.
- Maximum occupancy is 6 people.
- Queen, full, and twin beds.
- Each cabin has table, grill, and fire ring.
- Cabins are 24'x24', with an 8'x24' porch.
- Check-in time is after 3 p.m.
- Checkout time is noon.
- Quiet time starts at 10:30 p.m., and all visitors not staying in the cabins must depart by 10:30 p.m.
- No Smoking.
- No keg beer.
- Crockpots and other heat-generating appliances may drain the solar system's battery storage.



Cabins are nestled between woods and prairie, and are within walking distance to Fontana Lake, trails, and Fontana Park attractions. Located on the west side of Fontana Park.

Sustainable Living Cabins provide overnight comfort while using many energy and water conservation measures. These measures include:

- All electricity is produced by solar panels
- Walls and ceiling constructed from Structural Insulated Panels (SIPs)
- Triple pane windows
- Water conserving plumbing
- Use of native and local materials
- Comfort air flow design
- Promoting outdoor enjoyment



Other Sustainability Features

- Water Conservation Sensor faucets and dual-flush toilets assure only the amount of water needed is used.
- Nature's Resources Oak bat and board siding was harvested locally from Buchanan County forests.
- Keeping it Local Most materials in the cabin were manufactured and installed by people from within 60 miles of Fontana Park
