




Kennedy Park Playscape Open Shelter 1415 Nelson Ave. Fort Dodge

Two different kits are available each week: one for ages 4-6 & one for age Register By: June 7th & 21st / July 12 & 26th



QUALITY OF LIFE IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS









The Webster County Board of Supervisors and Webster County Conservation Board have created a new initiative that will enhance the conservation and recreation opportunities in Webster County.

The Webster County Board of Supervisors is embarking on a visionary plan to implement a variety of infrastructure projects that will improve Webster County's quality of life and make our communities better places to live, work and play!

The plan includes the construction of a riverfront, conservation education center and several recreational trail projects. The projects were identified in the recent Webster County "Hike & Bike" Trail Master Plan and Parks, Recreation & Facilities Master Plan.

These "Quality of Life" projects will be primarily funded through a bond that will be re-paid by the county's Tax Increment Financing Program. The supervisors understand the importance of providing healthy, livable communities and the role they play in workforce recruitment and retention. The funding for these projects is made possible through the economic growth of the region and the supervisors are excited to reinvest these funds in Webster County's "quality of life" initiatives.


RIVERFRONT NATURE CENTER

The proposed Riverfront Nature Center is a building facility located on the east bank of the Des Moines River, west of downtown Fort Dodge. Facility highlights include classroom and learning lab space, kitchen and restroom facilities, exhibit space and administrative offices, as well as outdoor classroom space in the adjacent courtyard. The Nature



Center acts as a hub to multiple outdoor passive recreation opportunities on site, and connects to multiple outdoor learning and interpretive spaces. This center will be the flagship facility for Webster County Conservation administrative and educational functions.

BADGER CONNECTION



This trail was identified in the Hike and Bike WC Master Plan as an important connection for the Prairie Rivers Trails System. The Badger Trail Connection would extend from the Nature Trail Extension at 160th Street to a newly constructed trailhead in Badger. It is proposed to be located along the east side of Paragon Avenue, allow trail users to access the popular Soldier Creek Winery along the way. Ideally, it would be located at the back of the ditch along the highway to allow comfortable separation from motorized vehicles.



BADGER LAKE LOOP

The Badger Lake Loop Trail at Kennedy Memorial Park is popular with people hiking, running and mountain biking. However, its current state as a 6– to 8– foot -wide granular trail with extremely steep slopes is not suitable for many other people biking, those pushing a stroller or those using mobility devices.



This project will pave 1.4 miles of trail stretching from the campgrounds at the southwest portion of the lake, around the north side of the lake, to the park entrance at the southeast side of the lake. The trail will be widened to 10 feet and the slopes will be ADA-compliant.

Henderson Landing—Webster County's Newest Water Trail Access



The Webster County Conservation Board recently purchased 2.73 acres from a Dean & Sharon Henderson along the Des Moines River at Kalo to construct a public water trail access. The Henderson's agreed to sell a portion of their land to create the access as they had safety concerns about paddlers using a busy stretch of highway along the Kalo Bridge to access the river.

The proposed project was identified as a high-priority location to add an additional access point on the Des Moines River during a recent a planning effort with the City of Fort Dodge and the lowa Department of Natural Resources. The new access is located half-way between Fort Dodge and Dolliver State Park. The popular and scenic area is known for its large glacial erratics, Woodman Hollow State Preserve and rich history in brick and tile production. The new access will divide this 16-mile stretch in half and allow for a more manageable day trip. In addition, the new boat ramp will provide much needed access for emergency personnel and first responders along this remote stretch of the Des Moines River. This will save valuable time in the event of an emergency on the water or ice.




