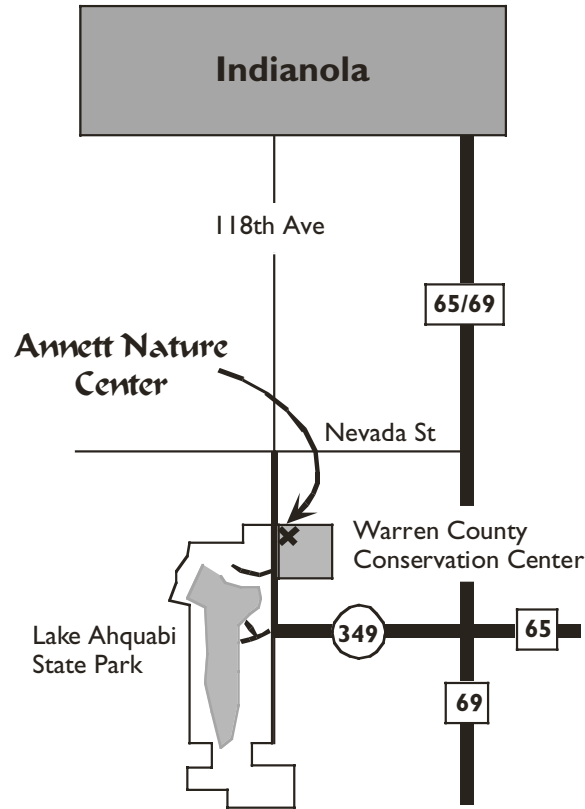


A Brief History

The Annett Nature Center opened on Earth Day in 1997. The result of years of planning and work by the Warren County Conservation Board, and the foresight and benevolence of Warren County Citizens such as Ellis Annett, the ANC is an approximately 9,500 square foot building in three levels on 160 acres.

The ANC sits on a hillside above a six-acre pond and a ten-acre wetland and is adjacent to Lake Ahquabi State Park. The ANC was also built with proceeds from the sale of the Warren County Farm and with REAP (Resource Enhancement and Protection) funds.

A Resource for All

The ANC serves as the hub for WCCB activities. Maintenance operations are located a short distance away on the same grounds. The Center serves as the focal point for many school field trips and the WCCB Day Camps.

The Annett Nature Center features miles of trails, fishing, prairie plantings, a butterfly garden, a small reading/bird watching room, a full kitchen, a classroom, large deck and displays on two levels, as well as housing the education and administrative offices of the Warren County Conservation Board and the Iowa Department of Natural Resources Wildlife Biologist for Warren, Polk, Marion and Jasper Counties.



Butterfly Garden

The Butterfly Garden at the Annett Nature Center is dedicated to the memory of longtime Warren County Conservation Board employee Ken Ball's late wife, Dorothy, and in recognition of Ken's long and heartfelt service to the board. The garden, situated in the center of the circle drive at the ANC, serves as a centerpiece for the entrance to the Annett Nature Center. It consists of numerous raised flower beds, built from native Iowa field stone with crushed brick walkways. The center bed also houses a pair of small ponds and a cascading waterfall surrounded by a brick patio and benches. The outside of the circle drive is set off with large Iowa stones with small flower beds between them.

The flower beds, planted in 1999, hold a large number of native prairie plants that bloom spring, summer and fall. White, purple, orange, yellow and blue are just a few of the colors to be seen. Adding even more interest are the retaining wall terraces on the west side of the building, also planted to flowering native plants, and the prairie restoration area surrounding the ANC, consisting not only of flowering plants, but a variety of native prairie grasses as well.

Programs, Open Hours

WCCB naturalists are available to give group tours and programs at the ANC. To schedule a program call the WCCB office.

The ANC is open 8:00 A.M.-4:30 P.M. Monday through Friday and NOON-4:00



P.M. Sunday. Weekday schedules sometimes require that all staff be away from the center, so it is always best to call ahead during the week.
