

Equestrian Trail Rules



1. Horses, mules and donkeys only.
2. Ride on signed trails only.
3. No riding within 24 hours of a measurable rainfall.
4. No tying of animals to trees or other vegetation.
5. No commercial use of trail such as paid trail rides or horse rental businesses. The trail is provided for recreational use only.
6. No temporary corrals or stalls.
7. Trail hours are sunrise to sunset.
8. Trail is open during months of June, July, and August.
9. No alcohol allowed.
10. All trash must be carried out with you.

All riders must have a Clinton County Conservation equestrian permit to ride on the trails. Permits are available for \$10/rider/season and available through the Clinton County Conservation Board office. Riders must have a permit in their possession while riding as well as a copy in the window of their vehicles. Daily permits are available at the trail head for \$2/rider/day.

If you are found violating any of the equestrian trail rules or other rules and regulations of the Clinton County Conservation Board, your equestrian trail privileges may be revoked.
